BK&A On High-Rise Building Construction

It is quite unfortunate that we are committing the same mistakes that the West committed in the 1960s. Glass is not suitable for the hot climate, while in the West, more glass is desirable to let in more heat and light. Here we let in all the heat and then rely on artificial methods of controlling the indoor thermal comfort through air conditioning. India will not be able to afford the amount of energy that we are using, and to improve the standards of living of the people, energy is not the only thing we require.

One of the major problems that Indian cities are facing is the migration to the existing cities, as they act as magnets attracting people from the rural areas. The existing cities are growing and affecting their infrastructure. When the cities are developing, the slum population is also growing, as is the number of families without houses and those living in substandard houses.

If we had targeted the new development towards new cities or if our small towns and villages had become bigger, then we would have been able to address these issues in a better way.

The high-rise buildings built in Taipei, Delhi, São Paulo, or Addis Ababa look the same, and we should attempt to design a high-rise building that is suitable for the Indian conditions, which include its culture and traditions.


Meet Our Designs

Mythilyas is a royal bungalow in the heart of Chennai, which was designed by Benny Kuriakose and Associates. The grandiosity of the stone-clad, five bedroom residence is nestled within the lush trees surrounding the house. It projects a private and homely space that welcomes one inside to wind down from the stimulating life of the city. The massive front door is the house's focal point, taking up more than three-fourths of the wall and creating a sense of warmth and welcome. The dim and ambient interior is a contrast to the bright and lush landscape on the exterior.

The interiors are adorned with timber doors, furniture, and other elements, which add a traditional touch to the contemporary design of the house. With its marble inlay, timber joinery, and timber carvings, craftsmen from far and wide have come together to contribute to the creation of this wonderfully detailed mansion house.


