


Meet Our Designs

The terrace floor is partially covered by a Mangalore tiled roof, which offers seclusion and weather protection while enabling a delightful breeze to flow via the opening between the parapet wall and the roof end. The light-colored interior is strikingly contrasted by the black furnishings and wall decorations Colorful handmade ceramic tiles were used to add a distinctive touch to the home in a number of locations, such as the bathrooms and the terrace party area.
