These include selecting appropriate technologies, using the best and not the cheapest method of construction, employing life-cycle assessment, seeking out local sources of energy and materials, and employing local building skills and know-how.

Pedanandipadu House

Pedanandipadu House mirrors the traditional context of Guntur in Andhra Pradesh. The layers of the steep roofs distinguish the house from the rest while providing a shield against the harsh heat and direct sunlight. The extensive and uninterrupted veranda on the northern side surrounding the house is also a protective measure from heat and rain, apart from its aesthetic and contextual factors. Nature is welcomed indoors through open areas and courtyards, where communal spaces open up and blend in.


The design of the house is planned with fluidity, where the carved pillars demarcate each space from one another rather than walls. Moreover, the fluid design permits a good indoor climate and cross-ventilation. Each of the openings has a sunshade with an elegantly carved support, which protects the walls from direct heat. The bedrooms are spacious and minimalistically designed. The brightly coloured athangudi tiles contrast with the plain, white walls, thus directing focus to the floor. The vintage decor and timber members blend well with the traditional aesthetic.
